ВСТУП

Метою вивчення навчальної дисципліни «Практична граматика англійської мови» є сформувати у студентів розуміння основних принципів та закономірностей граматичної будови сучасної англійської мови в аспекті її структури та функціонування; навчити їх розрізняти та правильно вживати основні граматичні одиниці; аналізувати та інтерпретувати основні граматичні форми і конструкції; розвивати науково-лінгвістичне мислення студентів, уміння працювати з навчальною та науковою літературою.

Основними завданнями вивчення дисципліни «Практична граматика англійської мови» є подати студентам теоретично обґрунтовану та систематизовану інформацію з основних розділів граматики; сформувати навички правильного вживання необхідних граматичних форм у практиці мовлення, аналізувати граматичні явища, користуючись науковою лінгвістичною термінологією, розвивати уміння працювати з науковою літературою.

За результатами вивчення дисципліни у здобувачів повинні бути сформовані такі компетентності:

загальні:

– акмеологічна – здатність визначити, отримати доступ, проаналізувати й об'єднати інформацію з різних джерел, документів та текстів для вирішення відповідних завдань лінгвістичного дослідження, здатність знаходити, відбирати, контекстуалізовувати та інтерпретувати значний масив архівного, документального, текстологічного матеріалу;

– інформаційна – здатність до пошуку, обробки й подальшого використання інформації з професійною метою, здатність використовувати мультимедійні та мережеві технології, ресурси Інтернет для забезпечення дистанційної форми навчання у ВНЗ;

спеціальні:

– володіння основними поняттями практичної граматики;

– усвідомлення особливостей граматичної будови сучасної англійської мови;

– розуміння особливостей природи граматичних одиниць, процесів та явищ сучасної англійської мови;

– вільне володіння поняттями про граматичні значення, форму та функції частин мови;

– знання граматичних категорій частин мови;

– практичне оволодіння граматичними правилами слововжитку в сучасній англійській мові;

– уміння застосовувати граматичні правила, знання про форми і функції мовних одиниць у практиці усного (непідготовленого, діалогічного, монологічного) та писемного мовлення, усного та писемного перекладу;

– уміння аналізувати граматичні явища англійської мови, застосовуючи відповідний термінологічний апарат;

– уміння працювати з науковою лінгвістичною літературою.

Дисципліна вивчається у перших двох семестрах навчання. У методичних вказівках викладено зміст навчального матеріалу та його розподіл за семестрами і темами. Вивчення курсу «Практична граматика англійської мови» у 1-ому семестрі завершується складанням заліку, у 2-ому – складанням екзамену (питання до заліку та екзамену додаються).

Методичні вказівки містять додатки, у яких подано таблиці з найбільш проблемних питань граматики англійської мови, а також глосарій.

Методичні вказівки призначено для студентів філологічного факультету.
